Catholic Education Week Theme: Igniting Hope

Throughout Catholic Education Week, we ask you to reflect on the significance of Catholic education's presence and contribution in our Church, and in our society.

May 3 – May 8, 2020 is Catholic Education Week.

The theme for CEW 2020, *Igniting Hope*, was inspired by three sources:

- The recent Papal Exhortation, *Christus Vivit*, by Pope Francis following the 2018 Synod of Bishops on Young People, the Faith and Vocational Discernment
- The recent Ontario Bishops' pastoral letter, *Renewing the Promise* (2018)
- The *Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations* by the Institute for Catholic Education (2011)

During Catholic Education Week, the students at St. Basil Catholic School will be demonstrating a spirit of hope, awareness and reflection on the significance of Catholic education's presence and contribution in our Church and in our society. We invite all members of our community, to participate in the celebrations and activities that will mark the celebration of Catholic Education Week 2020 in our school.

Various activities will take place during the week; highlights of specific activities will be posted in the newsletter, emailed, sent via Twitter and on our website.

The Catholic Education week will initiate with a liturgy and conclude with the crowning of Mary. The sub-themes for Catholic Education Week 2020 are as follows:

Monday: Our Hope in Christ
Tuesday: The Hope Within Us
Wednesday: The Hope Among Us
Thursday: Hope for the World
Friday: A Future Full of Hope

Faith Formation:

Forming ourselves in our Catholic faith is a foundational element in helping each of us understand and live in the example of Christ.

This year our continued focus will to be on Scripture as per our School Board Learning Plan Cycle. As a school community, we endeavor to begin each day with morning prayers that concentrate on the scripture readings. Scripture readings will be explained in student friendly language. The readings are reflected upon in a variety of ways and integrated throughout the curriculum.

St. Basil Catholic School participates in various activities that support both adult and student faith formation. These activities include daily prayers and reflections with a focus on the Virtue of the Month and selected Catholic Graduate Expectations. Staff meetings all begin with prayer and/or short liturgy that will focus on the themes of Hope and Communities of Faith.

Our Virtues are celebrated at the school and in classrooms. We acknowledge and highlight students who have demonstrated the virtue of the month during these celebrations. We celebrate school wide masses and Liturgies throughout the year. Our Grade 2 and 7 students prepare for the sacraments of Reconciliation, Communion and Confirmation. Each month the Rosary Apostolate volunteers visit our school to pray the rosary with each class.

Our school has staff members who are Faith Ambassadors as well as Youth Faith Ambassadors more commonly known at the school as Student Leaders who provide by example a devotion to our faith and commitment to encourage others to express themselves through faith-based activities including prayer and faith in action initiatives. Our Youth Faith Ambassadors assist in food/clothing drives, Christmas outreach initiatives, liturgies, and other special events throughout the year.

Annually, staff and faculty have an opportunity to participate in adult faith formation through the Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board Adult Faith Ambassador program. Both staff and students regularly participate in various gathering, liturgies and retreats throughout the year.

Sacramental Preparation:

As Catholics, we understand sacraments to be "outward signs instituted by Christ to give grace." Together in partnership with our parish, we support the preparation of God's children in receiving the sacraments. Please note all Parent information meetings and Sacramental Celebrations are held at Sts. Martha and Mary Parish.

Social Justice / Outreach Activities / Charities:

Catholic Social Teachings of the Church root our actions in supporting human dignity and the preferential option of the poor which calls us to serve the most vulnerable in the world.

Our school participates in various outreach activities and supports organizations such as ShareLife, food banks and the like. Our Youth Faith Ambassadors/Student Leaders and Faith Works organize food drives throughout the school year as well as raise funds to support the 34 agencies of ShareLife. Staff also contribute to ShareLife by participating in casual dress days on Fridays, coat drives and contribute to the food drive.

Celebrating Virtues:

A virtue is a habit or established capacity to perform good actions according to a moral standard. When we practice these virtues, we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us.

Virtue Celebrations

Through teacher modeling of our Catholic faith and the virtues program, each child develops spiritually, emotionally, physically and academically. Virtues education is celebrated during morning announcements, classroom activities and at virtue assemblies at different times throughout school year, led by our primary, junior and intermediate divisions. The school also has a Virtue display that highlights our virtues of the month.

Visible Signs of our Faith:

Through symbol and service, we are instruments of God's love whose work within our communities stands as a witness to our faith.

Our school has many visible signs our Catholic Faith including crosses, bibles, prayer tables and evidence of community services throughout the school. Our foyer is decorated with an altar, cross and a statue of Mother Mary.

Display cases proudly highlight our commitment to our Virtues and Catholic Faith. All classrooms and common areas such as the library and office area have Sacred spaces dedicated to prayer and reflection.

Our faculty, staff and students serve as witness to our faith by their daily interactions and by devoting time to community events that help those in need.
